* Franklin University has a requirement that all students must meet Algebra Competency. This can be met in the following ways:

1. High School Level Algebra II (Must get C- or better)
2. Transfer of Algebra Competency on Transfer Guide (Course will be listed)
3. Taking MATH 150 with Franklin University
4. Transferring in a higher level math, course must have algebra pre-requisite for example, College Algebra, Calculus, or Trigonometry

Please note that Statistics will not waive Algebra Competency

General Education Notes:

- Please review the Florida State College at Jacksonville Catalog for General Education Requirements (GER).
- CLAS (College Level Academic Skills): Satisfaction of these skills is a graduation requirement for the associate in arts degree in the state college system of Florida. Students must meet one of the approved exemptions – see the catalog for more information.
- The state university Foreign Language Requirement does not apply to students transferring to Franklin University.
- All General Education courses require a grade of “C” or above.
- Students will complete additional General Education courses at Franklin University. Students must meet the FU General Education Requirements.

Prerequisite and Elective Notes:

- All prerequisite courses require a grade of “C” or above.
- A major prerequisite course may satisfy both Florida State College at Jacksonville General Education Requirements and FU Major Prerequisites.
Please review the General Education Requirements and talk with an advisor.
- Electives must have the appropriate AA (for AA degree students), AS (for AS degree students), or AAS (for AAS degree students) notation at the end of the course description in Florida State College at Jacksonville catalog.

Other Notes:

- Students must complete the Information Literacy Assessment requirement prior to graduation from Florida State College at Jacksonville.
- Qualified students will have completed an associate degree before transferring.
